NEW YORK: Government-mandated social distancing

**March 7, 2020** State of Emergency to August 29 [Extended to August 29, 2020](#)

**July 20, 2020** Phase 4: New York City without indoor activity at malls, restaurants or cultural institutions. <https://forward.ny.gov/reopening-new-york-city>

Phase 4: All Other Regions of New York [Phase 4 Guide; Guide for Phases - %positive results](#)

**Executive orders 202.17 & 202.18** : all to wear masks in public

**July 21, 2020** [205 restrictions on travelers arriving in NY from states with high COVID 19 rates](#) ; [Travel Advisory - states must quarantine for 14 days](#) Newly added: Rhode Island. Delaware and Washington, D.C. have been removed but those part-way through a quarantine must continue with the 14 days.

**EDUCATION Guidelines** - Regions must be in Phase 4 [K to 12 Education reopening guidelines](#) ; [Higher Education Guidelines](#);

VERMONT: Government-mandated social distancing

**June 15, 2020:** Before arrival in Vermont, Travelers can do 1. 14-day quarantine or 7 day with negative test result at home with limited stops in personal vehicle or 2. in Vermont lodging if stops are made or if traveling by plane, train, bus

**June 26, 2020:** expanded limits for event venues, arts, culture, restaurants: up to 50% occupancy; 75 people indoor, 150 outdoor

**July 10, 2020** [Relaxation of Travel Restrictions from select states](#) <400 cases/million Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut and New York

**September 8, 2020** School start date

[stalled](#) Masks required in all indoor spaces; businesses may not assume that an unmasked customer cannot medically tolerate a face covering, though they may accept a customer's verbal representation to that effect.

**March 24, 2020** Border Checkpoints: Essential services; non-essential: 14 day self-isolation

**June 26, 2020** Restaurants, bars 100%, Private campgrounds.

**July 3, 2020** Business or Organization: Outdoor: 250 people; Indoor: 50 per cent capacity Max. 200; Family event 50 people all with social distancing. [Atlantic Travel Bubble](#) NS, NB, PEI, NF&LAB [Travel from outside Atlantic Canada](#)

**July 31, 2020** Wearing a [non-medical mask](#) is required in most indoor public places: Exemptions: Children < 2 or 2 to 4 if caregiver can't get them to wear a mask; People with a valid medical reason. Schools, day cares and day camps continue to follow their sector-specific plans.

**June 19 ease of restrictions:** Overnight camps, sports, long term care facilities visits, N.B. residents working outside NB in Canada do not have to self-isolate, Canadian property owners can enter NB but must isolate 14 days, Removal of cap on number of people at pools, churches, rinks, Contact tracing for indoor gatherings. Social distancing / hygiene options required.

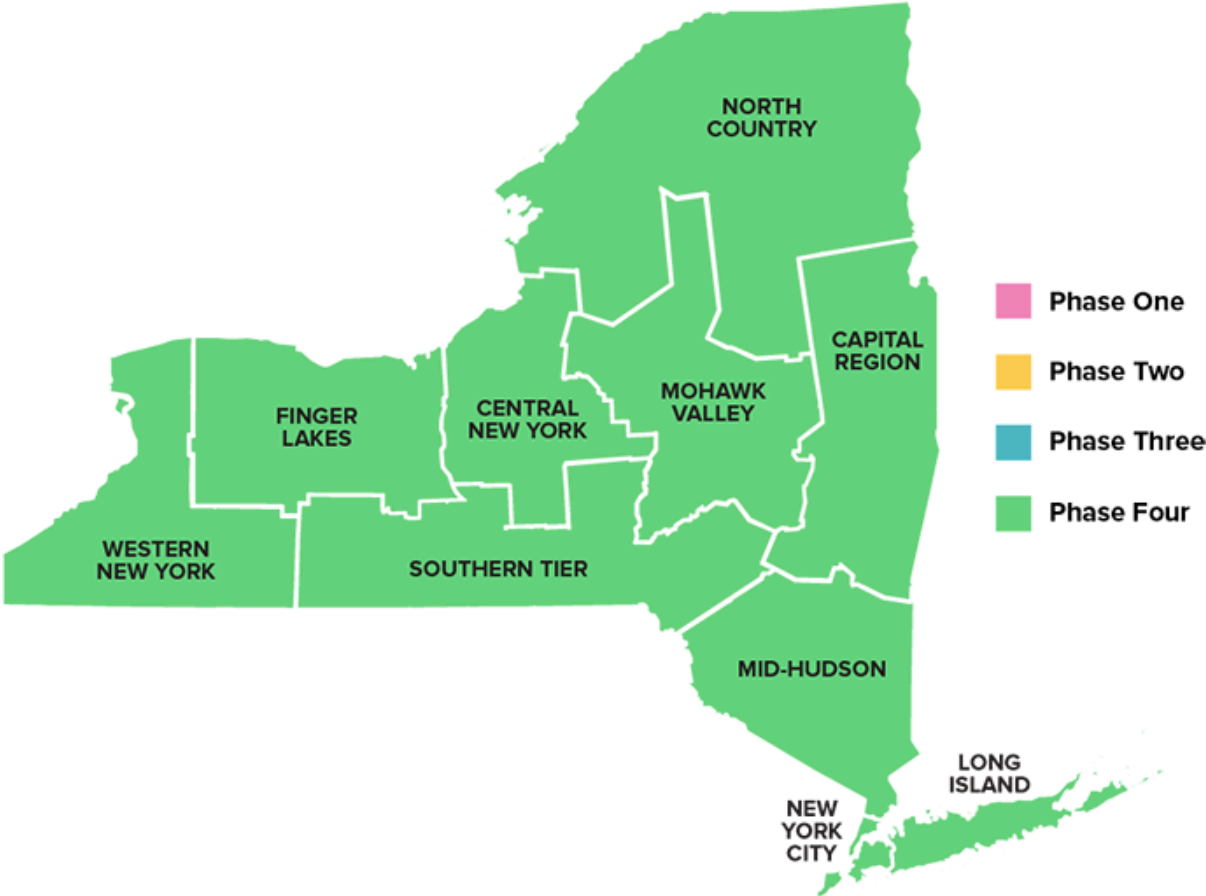

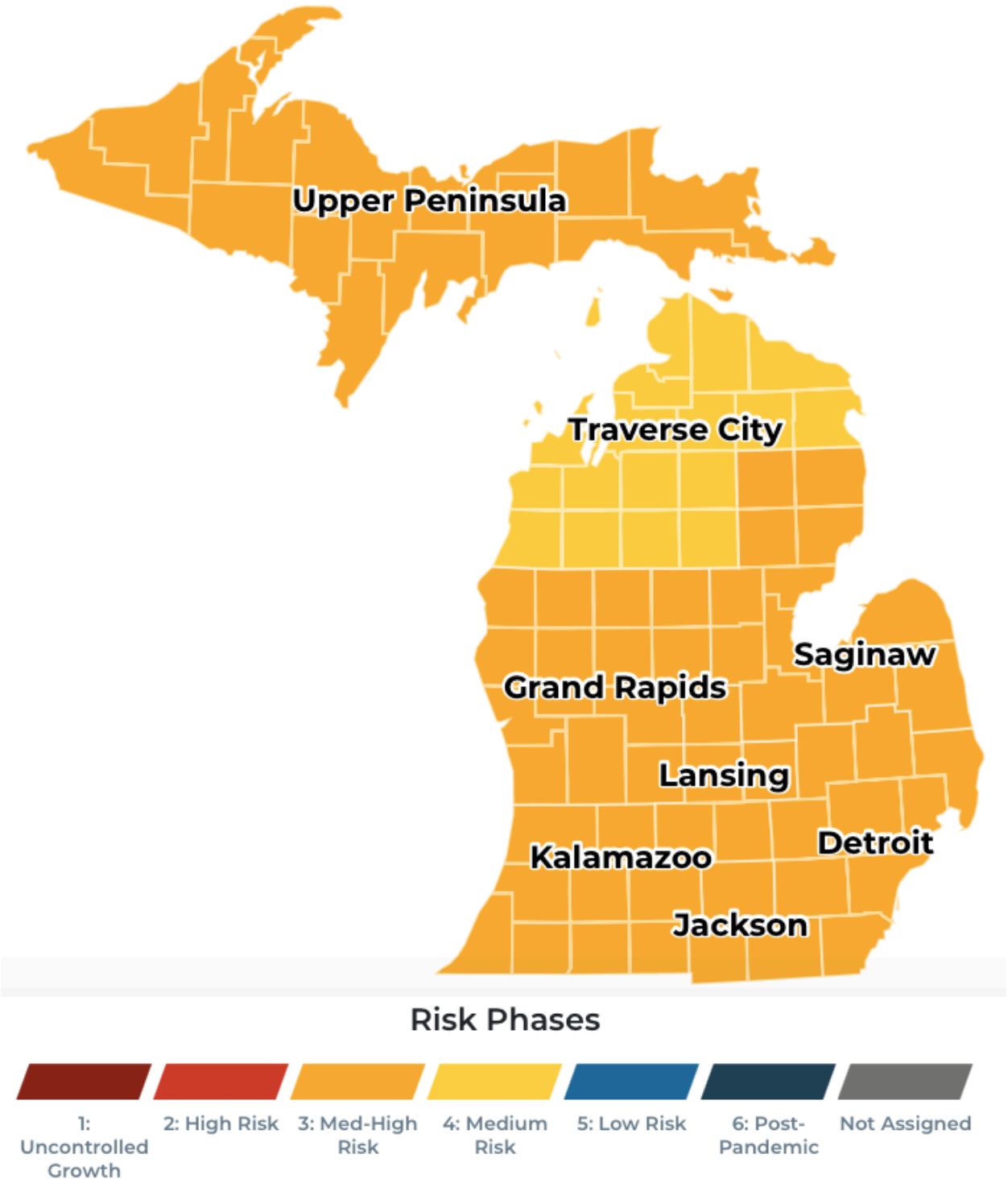

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## Vermont

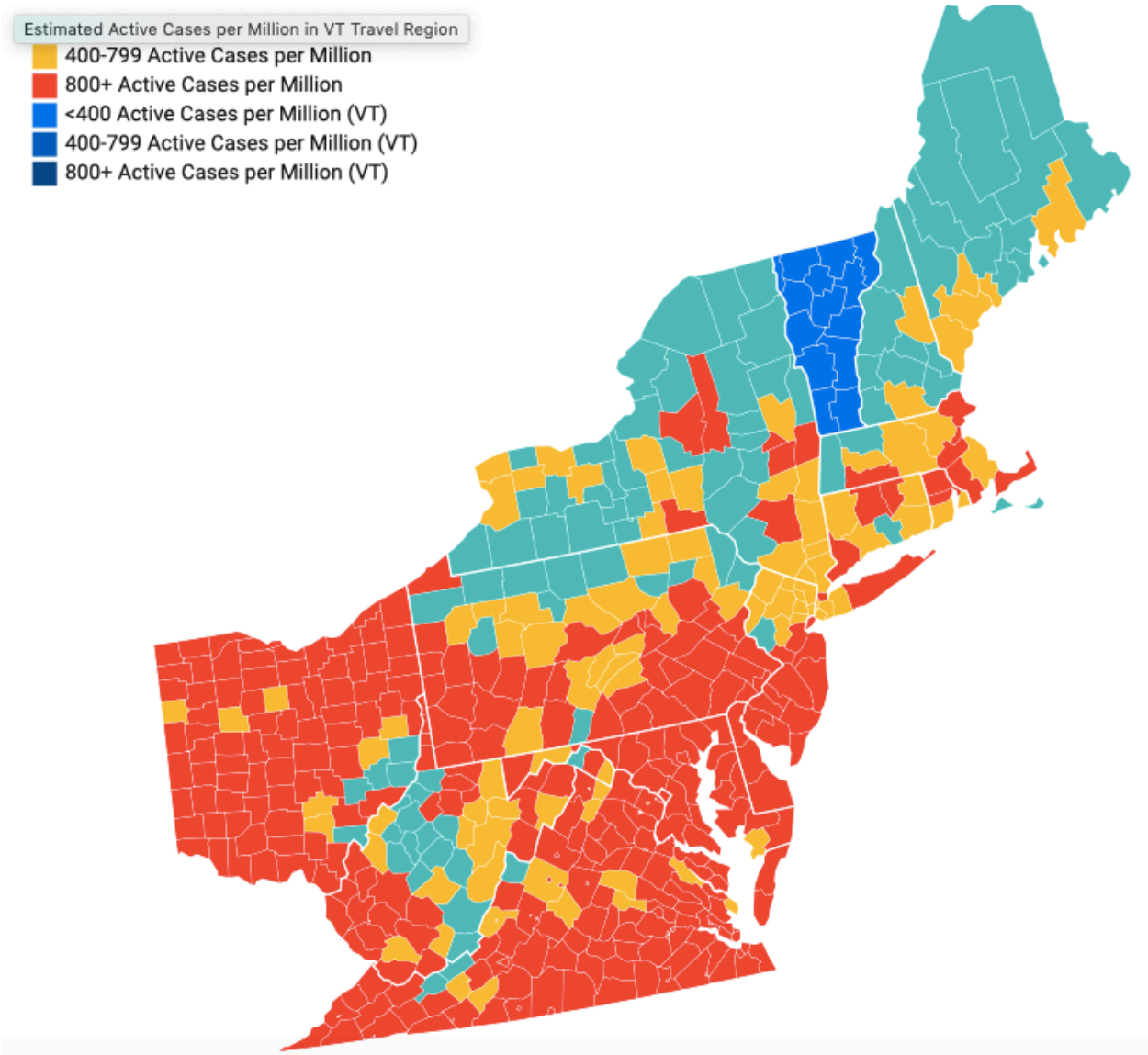
The State of Vermont has determined that any county with less than 400 active cases of COVID-19 per one million residents is now eligible for quarantine-free leisure travel.

## [Restart Vermont Economy](#)

### [Leisure Travel from Counties no quarantine needed](#)

Visitors from **green** counties may travel to Vermont with no quarantine, while those from **yellow** or **red** counties are subject to travel restrictions. **Vermont** counties are evaluated via different metrics, and so are exempt from travel restrictions.
