General logistics and supply chain trends and challenges:


Canada - US Trade: \$1.6 Billion a day in goods & 300,000 people per day cross our borders

- •Motor carriers prices are increasing, motor carrier revenue is up by 6.2%
- Motor carriers handle 77% of the freight volume in the US
- •Rail prices are also up, as are revenues, by 15.3%
- Intermodal freight volume is up 4.9%
- Air, Water and Pipeline revenues are in decline
- Inventory carrying costs are up by 7.6% due to higher costs of taxes, insurance, obsolescence and depreciation. An important factor in considering mode choice and transit times!
- Driver shortages are rising!
- Sustainability is ever more important!
- Uncertain global economic trends?
- Natural disasters and climate change impacts?
- Terrorism risk mitigation and its effects on the supply chain?

U.S. Diesel Fuel and Crude Oil Prices




