


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## What are Centers?




- Virtual organizations that leverage technology to bring work to the Center
- Coordinated from a strategic location
- Aligned by key industry sectors
- Bring existing expertise together to authoritatively facilitate trade
- Provide a single point of processing for participating importers
- Serve as resource to the broader trade community and to CBP's U.S. government partners


## **How Centers Operate**

- 60 ports conduct entry summary reviews


## **Center Operations**

## Goals of Centers

### 1) Facilitate legitimate trade through effective risk segmentation

- Utilize account based methods to process trade
- Expand partnerships move more importers to trusted trader status
- Develop and implement comprehensive strategies to manage risk

### 2) Increase industry-based knowledge within CBP

- Advance bi-directional education to raise industry knowledge
- Engage industry groups and key stakeholders

### 3) Enhance enforcement and address industry risks

- Leverage industry to identify issues of mutual interest to provide CBP with targeting, enforcement, and/or intelligence information
- Coordinate enforcement efforts by industry to address unique risks

### Milestone Dates

- April 15, 2013: Center initiates operations
- June 14, 2013: CBP HQ notifies three test applicants on their selection as test participants in the IMM CEE
- July 8, 2013: Center begins post entry processing for the three test participants
- August 2013 June 2014: Center accepted additional test participants







## Mandatory Dates for Transition to ACE

Date	Mandatory Requirement	Time Remaining
May 1, 2015	Mandatory use of ACE for electronic import and export manifest	11 months
November 1, 2015	Mandatory use of ACE for electronic Cargo Release and related Entry Summary filings	17 months
October 1, 2016	Mandatory use of ACE for all remaining portions of the CBP cargo process	28 months



# IMM CEE Import Highlights

 \$139.4 billion in industrial and manufacturing materials come into the U.S. (4.5% of all imported value)

- Top 5 countries of origin account for 79% of these imports
  - Canada (\$31.6 billion)
  - Mexico (\$16.3 billion)
  - China (\$15 billion)
  - Israel (\$8.8 billion)
  - India (\$6.7 billion)



### Positive Outcomes of the CEE

- Provides an increase in industry knowledge facilitation, enforcement, uniformity
- Allows for facilitation of "trusted partners" and resources focused on enforcement
- Centralizes a point of contact-phone, email, web site postings
- Promotes consistency in the import process
- Reduces costs and improves release times
- Enhances benefits for trusted partners that are tailored to industry
- Improves enforcement and prevents unsafe imports from reaching consumers
