




# Niagara Region – Transportation Network





# International Bridges

- Queenston/Lewiston Addition of a fifth lane on the bridge, and construction of a 2.7 km express truck lane along Highway 405
- Whirlpool Rapids NEXUS only
- Peace Bridge Toll plaza improvements
- Rainbow study to provide more direct access to tourist area of Niagara Falls, Ontario

# Ontario Critical Infrastructure Assurance Program


The Ontario Critical Infrastructure Assurance Program is a Province-wide program to:

- Identify Ontario's critical systems infrastructure, facilities, technologies, assets, networks, processes and services
- Assess the interconnectedness and interdependencies of these critical systems, and
- Develop strategies to increase the resiliency of these critical systems.

Sectors include Transportation, Food and Water Services, Electricity, Continuity of Government, Health, Telecommunications, Financial Institutions, Public Safety and Security, and Oil and Gas.




## **Emergency Detour Routes (EDR)**




