




Border Closing

- This incident closed the bridge
 - Closed around 12:30pm
 - Reopened around 2:30pm

Quick Delay Analysis

- Only in the US
- Only on freeways
- Compared delay to the following day, Wednesday, April 15th, 2015




I-69 Eastbound
