

### Highway Infrastructure

- Consists of over 55,000 km's of provincially maintained roads and highways.
- Including over 4,700 km's of National Highway System highways and intermodal links.
- Including 4-lane arterial divided highway corridors which allow permitted LCV truck traffic. (twin 53 foot trailer units – truck trains)
- Through New Brunswick there are 2 primary 4-lane divided highway trade corridors;
  - Route 2 (TCH connector to rest of Canada)
  - Route 1 (Gateway Hwy) connector to Maine, USA)





